

**MINUTES

The Monteagle City Council meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Mayor Rodman. After the prayer and the pledge of allegiance Alderman Parmley made a motion to approve the minutes of August 30, 2021. Alderman Favaloro seconded the motion and it passed 5/0. Then Alderman Parmley made a motion to approve the minutes of two public hearings held on August 30, 2021. Alderman Favaloro seconded the motion and it passed 5/0.

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Chief Jared Nunley gave his monthly report. The TBI audit went well. Mayor Rodman presented Officer Locke a plaque for the great job he has been doing for the department. There are grants being worked on for police equipment. Mayor Rodman stated that the Trahan's are giving a donation toward the new generator.

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STREET DEPARTMENT

Keith Butner reported that the reflectors are down and Marion County Highway department will be doing Church Street soon. We are working to get Laurel Lake finished. There is a question on the garden on the Mountain Goat Trail by Dubose and we will turn this over to Garrett Haynes. Nate is working with Garrett on other Mountain Goat issues. The company working on the ramp lights will be here next week. Christmas lights are on order and they are replacing the breaker boxes.

UTILITY

John Condra reported that R-W is getting the pump for the water plant. There was a complaint about two employees riding together. He addressed this and they are doing their jobs. Engineer Travis Wilson discussed grants for the water and sewer department. There was discussion on the GIS system that the water and sewer needs. There will be a special called meeting on October 18, 2021 at 8:00 am to vote on a budget amendment to allow the GIS project to go forward.

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FIRE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Greg Maloof gave the fire report. He reported that the Trahan's have pledged \$3000.00 for the purchase of a generator for the police department. If the city contributes \$2000.00 the Trahans will increase their pledge to \$5000.00. We are collecting donations for a fire truck and the fire department would like to have polo shirts.

BUILDING INSPECTOR

Mr. Earl Geary reported he had no business permits. He discussed tiny homes and they are only allowed in an R-4 zoning which we currently have no R-4 zone. He has three building permits.

PARKS & REC

Mr. Andy Patel approached the council about starting a cricket league, which would host games at the Monteagle ballpark on Saturday evenings from 10 pm to 1 am. He was asked to get a contract drawn up and will pay costs. There will be a Trunk or Treat on October 28th from 5-8 and a movie at the Pavilion at 6:30 pm. They are working on getting playground equipment. The Christmas parade will be December 4th and Shop Monteagle will be December 1st and 2nd.


CITIZENS HEARING

Mr. Waller presented a report and we will give this to the engineer.


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There being no other business the meeting adjourned at 8:00 pm.
