FIRE DEPARTMENT

Mr. Scott Parish from MSSA presented them with a check for \$55,250.00 as a donation toward the purchase of the fire truck. The town has gotten several other donations in the amount of around \$20,000.00.

Mayor Rodman presented Susan Johnson with the Isaiah 117 House a donation of \$500.00.

Greg Maloof reported that the Safety Day at the school was a success. The department collected another insurance claim. This money will be used to buy equipment for the department. There was discussion on the surplus of the truck that is no longer needed. Alderman Wilson made a motion to sell the truck with a minimum bid. Alderman Powell seconded the motion and it passed 5/0. Alderman Powell made a motion to amend the budget and use \$20,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Fund to help with the Phase I of the Park Project. Alderman Parmley seconded the motion and it passed 5/0 on roll call vote. There will be Shop Local on December 2nd & 3rd at city hall and the Parade will be December 4th. There was discussion on hiring a coordinator for the Ball program. This will be January thru April 2022. Alderman Favaloro made a motion to hire Dominic for the Ball program. Alderman Wilson seconded the motion and it passed 5/0.

Monteagle Police Department attended with 3 police officers in attendance. The Monteagle Volunteer Fire Department attended with 6 firemen in attendance. The Chiefs of both Departments were present. Students were accompanied with their teachers by class. They heard presentations from each department as well as touring the vehicles – inside and out. A fire fighter wore the turn out gear as well as the oxygen mask. The Principal, Veronica Horton, was very pleased and appreciative of the Departments' efforts and participation.

The hydrant program will be performed by the water department and an outside contractor.

Because of the efforts of the Chief and Assistant Chief we have so far collected more than \$2,000.00 in insurance reimbursements. This is an ongoing program.
